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AMAZON RAINFOREST RIVERBOAT CRUISE: NAPO RIVER & PAÑACOCCHA LAGOON EXPLORATION

If you are planning a Galapagos Islands Cruise or Trek to Machu Picchu, consider extending your vacation to include the tropical rainforest of Ecuador. One of your extension options includes this riverboat cruise along the famed Napo River. Onboard your 30-passenger riverboat, see firsthand how the great rivers of this region are the lifeblood of birds, the home to caimans, fresh water river dolphins, piranhas, catfish and giant paiches. Butterflies of exquisite color, beauty and unusual size are common here, as well as the croaks of giant frogs. Howler monkeys thrive on a rich diet of insects only found in the Amazon. An unforgettable addition to any South American journey.

DAY 1

Flight from Quito to Coca and transfer to the Napo River port. Enjoy a motorized canoe ride downstream and deep into the Amazon basin for 1.5 hours to board our riverboat, which will begin its navigation downstream. A courteous crew attends to your needs and our English-speaking naturalist guides will introduce you to a surprising Amazon world, its people, more than 600 species of birds, and hundreds of botanical wonders. Our riverboat sails along different ecosystems and important natural reserves such as the Yasuní National Park and the Limoncocha Biological Reserve. Every night there will be additional activities such as conferences, review of the flora and fauna and optional night outings. (D)

DAY 2

Terra Firmae Forest, Lakes and Gorges

After breakfast, enjoy your first excursion to walk atop terra firma forest towards an internal lagoon in Yasuni National Park. Observe varying ecosystems

accompanied by your naturalist guide and take the opportunity to swim and fish for the famous piranha, time to rest and a picnic lunch. The return to the mighty Napo River will be onboard a native canoe, rowing along a small black water creek or gorge. (BLD)

DAY 3

Parrots and the Limoncocha Biological Reserve

An early departure today by motor canoe takes us to a very special corner of the jungle, the clay banks of the river where different species of parrots gather daily to eat. This clay helps them digest the seeds they feed on; it is quite a sight, colorful and noisy! Then back aboard the ship to sail upriver and reach one of the tributaries of the Napo to observe the flora and fauna, the enthusiastic pygmy monkeys and a trek to the only Biological Reserve of Ecuador. Upon reaching Limoncocha Lake, we will board a canoe and travel along the banks of this marshy ecosystem where over 470 species of birds have been recorded! There is a chance to fish for piranha, and for a short walk. Tonight, it is possible to observe the black caimans that inhabit the lagoon; night excursions offer an experience like no other – viewing wildlife in its nocturnal state, when the jungle is cool and quiet. Late return to the ship for dinner and overnight. (BLD)

DAY 4

Archeological Museum / Giants of the Forest / Local Family Visit

The adventure today begins with a visit to the Museum of Pompeya, a small archaeological sample with Amazonian funeral urns dating back several centuries, as well as utensils and ways of life of the ancient denizens of the rainforest. We will also have the opportunity to see the giant trees of the Amazon, like the kapok, which rises over the forest canopy to more than 80 meters high, with huge, protruding roots. Try your hand at rowing a canoe on a tranquil tributary of the river up to the house of a native family, to share a moment with them and learn their way of life. (BLD)

DAY 5

While we navigate upriver during breakfast, the guides wrap up our knowledge of the great Amazon region and say farewell. Transfer to the airport for your return flight to Quito. (B)

A FEW IMPORTANT DETAILS ABOUT YOUR TRIP...Read carefully

Full package includes: 4 night/5 day Cruise; All meals as indicated on itinerary (B= breakfast, L=lunch, D=dinner); expert naturalist guides; all day and night excursions; purified water, rubber boots, ponchos, lifejackets.

Not Included in your Trip Fee: International airfare, airport departure tax, in-country round trip flight (Quito/Coca/Quito) \$143; Yasuni National Park Fee \$25; optional Parrot Salt Lick visit \$25; airport departure tax; alcoholic beverages or soft drinks onboard; any meals not indicated on itinerary; gratuities to guides and crew; items of a personal nature.

About the ship and our crew: Our 90-foot, 30-passenger river cruise boat has 110-volt electricity onboard, air conditioning, boots and rain ponchos, guest laundry, and a full bar. A seasoned captain, 10 dedicated crew members, and one experienced, English-speaking naturalist guide attend to the details of your Amazon river cruise. Motorized canoes ferry passengers to shore for Jungle walks and village visits.

Weather Conditions: The Ecuadorian Amazon Basin is located in the Eastern part of the country and comprised mostly of untouched terra firma and flooded forest. The climate is Tropical, with an average year-round temperature of 26° C (79° F). Although it rains year round in the rainforest, the "rainy season" is from April to August. Nights sometimes get cool.

Transportation/Flight Arrangements: Please consult with Adventure Associates as you prepare your flight arrangements for the best time of arrival/departure.

Trip & Travel Insurance: We strongly recommend that travel insurance be purchased immediately following your registration. The insurance protects you and your money from late cancellations, accidents or illness in remote areas, emergency evacuation, and loss of baggage, airline flight changes and other unexpected delays. The particular program we recommend (Access America) will cover "preexisting" conditions if you purchase full coverage within fourteen (14) days following your registration. Information available upon request.

Complete the application form and return it to our office along with the appropriate payment. Upon receipt of your application, we will send you a confirmation and details about your pre-trip preparation.
